Create a schedule for meaningful and active involvement

Communicate your plan of engagement to your students

- ✓ Time frame for replies to emails/discussion questions
- ✓ Time frame for feedback
- ✓ How you plans to participate in online asynchronous activities
- ✓ How urgent or timely information will be communicated
- ✓ Other ways you plan to remain actively involved

Good planning and organization are critical to effective learning and student interest





Looking at a course through a student lens



- 1. Log-in to your Avenue course shell
- 2. Use screen share to 'walk through' one another's course (2-3 min)
 - As the 'student', ask the instructor to complete actions (e.g., click on, scroll down, etc.)
 - Instructor: refrain from offering any advice or explanation
- 3. Debrief: 'student' describes impressions, points of confusion, etc. (2-3 min)



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

Design quizzes with multiple attempts


Note: you can release different information after each attempt
